# Resources to Develop a Potential Employers List

The following resources can help you develop a potential employers list so you can find companies that match your skills, qualifications, and goals before you begin the application process.

## LIBRARY RESOURCES

### AtoZ Databases

Available remotely from the Monroe County Library System's website, this database can be used to make a list of prospective employers using search criteria such as business location, type of business, size, and more. Ask a librarian for help getting started or to suggest possible search strategies.

### Business Insights: Essentials

Available in the Business Insight Center at the Central Library, this database offers detailed company and industry profiles including SWOT reports, market share reports, and financial reports. Ask a librarian for help getting started or to suggest possible search strategies.

### Hoover's Company Directory

Available in the Business Insight Center at the Central Library, this database offers in-depth company information and allows users to create a list of companies using more than 175 search and segmentation filters.

### Magazine and Journal Articles

Look for magazine and journal articles about a company or industry. Visit your local library branch to browse print copies of local newspapers and magazines or read the full text of thousands of articles at home with your library card using the databases posted on the Monroe County Library System website. Ask a librarian for help finding newspapers and magazines, or to suggest possible search strategies.

### CITY

Search the archives of *CITY* newspaper for articles about Rochester-area companies, non-profits, and educational institutions. Access *CITY* online for free or pick up a free print copy at locations all over Rochester.

### Democrat & Chronicle

*Democrat and Chronicle* articles can be obtained from the Central Library's Local History Division, or you can access current articles and the previous two years of archived materials with a *Democrat and Chronicle* subscription. An additional subscription is required for full access to the archive.

### Join a local professional or trade association

Joining a local professional or trade association is a great way to network with other professionals in a specific industry or occupation and find information on local companies. Use the CareerOneStop website at [www.careeronestop.org](http://www.careeronestop.org) to find industry specific associations. Select "Toolkit" at the top of the page, then "Professional Association Finder." You can also ask a librarian for help finding a local chapter of a professional or trade association.

### New York State Business Directory

Search by industry or occupation to find a list of companies within a specified county, along with their contact information.

### Rochester Business Journal (RBJ)

The *RBJ* is the Greater Rochester area's weekly business newspaper, which has in-depth articles on local companies and the Rochester area business climate. Purchase a subscription directly from the *RBJ* website or visit the Central Library to access an online subscription of the *RBJ*. You can also find copies of the newspaper at the Central Library, as well as some of the city and town branches.
