Sponsored by the U.S. Department of Labor, CareerOneStop's Scholarship Finder database includes more than 8,000 scholarships, fellowships, loans, and other financial aid opportunities. Search criteria include specific award types, levels of study, geographic location, and affiliations (such as religion, race, disability, or profession).

Information at this site comes from the College Board's Annual Survey of Financial Aid Programs. Enter information about your background and educational goals, and the Scholarship Search tool will match you with scholarships, internships, research grants, and loans from more than 2,200 programs, totaling nearly \$6 billion. An account is required to use the search.

On this site, scholarship opportunities can be browsed by category: Athletic, Minority, Degree Level, Subject, State, and Student Type. Within these categories, in addition to traditional academic fields, you will find sections devoted to technical and vocational programs, automotive trades, and cosmetology. This site also features some unusual scholarships. Under "Student Type", you can find scholarship information for married students, foster children, twins, and even vegans, among others.

The IAAL's Hispanic Scholarship Program provides merit-based college scholarships to Hispanic high school seniors in Genesee, Livingston, Monroe, Ontario, Wayne, or Yates County.

Rochester Area Community Foundation

The Rochester Area Community Foundation administers more than 125 scholarships for students in the eight-county Rochester region. These scholarships are endowed by local individuals and organizations and may have specific eligibility criteria. For example, the Frank Commisso Golf Scholarship awards \$500 annually to students pursuing a golf related educational program at a two- or four-year school. In addition to college and vocational programs, some scholarships apply to special opportunities, such as summer camps, music lessons, or high school study abroad programs. A small number of scholarships are also available to cover tuition costs at local private high schools.

The Black Scholars Program provides recognition, assistance, and incentives to students who achieve and maintain a "B" or better average throughout high school. The program awards over \$2.5 million annually in scholarships to Black Scholars from school districts in Genesee, Livingston, Monroe, Ontario, Orleans, and Wayne counties.
