

You will find all of this and more in this year's Art of the Book exhibit!



As manager of the Cary technology collection, she is responsible for teaching and maintaining some 23 different presses and several hundred fonts of metal and wood type. She has lectured for the American Printing History Association, College Art Association, the Hamilton Wood Type & Printing Museum, TypeCon, The Typophiles, the U.S. Government Publishing Office, and Yale University.



Artist Books are...

works of art realized in the form of a book. They are often published in small editions, though sometimes they are produced as one-of-a-kind objects referred to as 'unique.'

Artist Books have employed a wide range of forms, including scrolls, fold-outs, concertinas, or loose items contained in a box as well as bound printed sheets. Artists have been active in printing and book production for centuries, but the artist book is primarily a late 20th century art form.

Altered Books are...

any book, old or new, that has been recycled by creative means into a work of art. They can be rebound, painted, cut, burned, folded, added to, collaged in, gold-leafed, rubber stamped, drilled or otherwise adorned...and yes, it is legal. They can also be composed entirely of unique materials.
