The Annual Campaign has generated \$61,625 as of September 30.

The Annual Campaign Month/YTD comparison shows an increased value of gifts so far this year. If you have already given to this year's campaign, thank you! It is encouraging that the increased giving that occurred during the pandemic is continuing:

- As of September 30, 2020: 568 gifts valued at \$51,842
- As of September 30, 2021: 473 gifts valued at \$49,585
- As of September 30, 2022: 489 gifts valued at \$61,625

Planning continues for FFRPL's participation in ROC the Day on November 29. This year's campaign project will support the funding of new chairs for the Kate Gleason Auditorium in the Bausch & Lomb Library Building. Please watch for a "Board Challenge" email within the next few weeks.

FFRPL submitted a grant proposal to the John F. Wegman Fund of RACF for \$3,300 for support of the Extension/Outreach Department. The proposal was selected for the second phase of review which was a Board member site visit on October 20.


A site visit for the Konar Foundation for their current \$50,000 grant to Safe to Be Smart will take place this Thursday, October 27.

FFRPL's first three Fall **Books Sandwiched In** reviews have gone well; we are averaging about 40 people (in person) for each event. We're also using the new technology FFRPL purchased which enables us (and the Library) to Livestream directly to the Library's YouTube channel. The next Books Sandwiched In review is on **November 8.** Curt Smith, senior lecturer at UofR will review Undelivered: The Never-Heard Speeches that Would Have Rewritten History by Jeff Nussbaum.

Since 2014, FFRPL has partnered with Rochester's non-profit literary center, Writers & Books, to bring their 'Rochester Reads' authors to Central Library. This year we will host **Jason Mott**

(author of the National Book Award-winning novel, *Hell of a Book*) for a free **reading and book-signing** at **Central Library** on **Wednesday, November 2, 12pm-1pm**. Register here.
